Spend time in a cabin at **Lakeside**. Deep in the woods, you can explore the Ten Mile River Reservation and utilize shared facilities across the property. The camp operates a waterfront on beautiful Lake Nianque. Bring your family and stay for a week, or a few days, in a cabin with your own kitchen and bathroom. Enjoy programs specifically for our Family Campers; bingo, karaoke, campfires, guided hikes and more!

DIRECTOR'S LEGACY UNIT RECOGNITION

The legacy unit recognition program rewards Troops for a tradition of camping at Ten Mile River Scout Camps. Units will gain legacy recognition credit for their tenure starting with their attendance during the summer of 2019. If your Troop had a Hold-A-Place in for 2020 and are attending camp 2021 you will qualify for the Year Three 3% rebate.

A unit must attend a TMR camp and have at least two leaders and four Scouts attend camp to qualify for a legacy recognition credit. A unit may camp at any of the Ten Mile River Scout Camps to gain a legacy recognition credit. The unit's legacy recognition credit will reset to 0 if a unit does not attend a Ten Mile River Scout Camp and will begin at 1 when the unit returns to Ten Mile River. Your Troop can also begin the Legacy journey in year 1 in 2021.

The unit will be rewarded with a rebate of a percentage of the rebate year's youth camp registration fees, paid in cash, check or credit card, at the completion of their third year, fifth year, seventh year, and ninth year. Campership assistance payments are excluded when calculating the rebate. Rebates will be made to the unit in the form of a GNYC gift card made available in September 2021.

Rappelling at Indian Cliffs

A timeless activity enjoyed by campers at TMR for over 90 years. Spend a morning or afternoon out of basecamp enjoying an amazing view. The 60-foot vertical rock face can be traversed by campers from all TMR Base Camps and Trek participants. Open to leaders and Scouts 13+ at no additional cost.



ATV Outpost Program

Scouts ages 15+ can spend a day learning ATV safety and tearing up the TMR Trails on our fleet of off-road quads. This day long course satisfies the requirements of the ATV Safety Institute. An additional fee of \$30 per person applies.



Historical Trails Award

The TMR Scout Museum sponsors the Historical Trails Award for registered Troops, Packs, Venture Crews and qualified non-scouting groups hiking these trails. Hikers satisfying trail requirements can earn a beautiful patch and medal with pins for miles hiked. Scouts can earn an additional award pin after a few hours of trail-work. Issued for free by the TMR Museum.



SPECIALTY CAMPS – Unique Opportunities for Scouts

During a Specialty Camp Session Scouts can try activities, learn new things, and earn additional merit badges and certifications which are not traditionally offered in a standard week of summer camp.

Specialty Camp Fee: \$480 (\$530 after May 1st) | SCUBA Adventure \$595 (Youth or Adults)

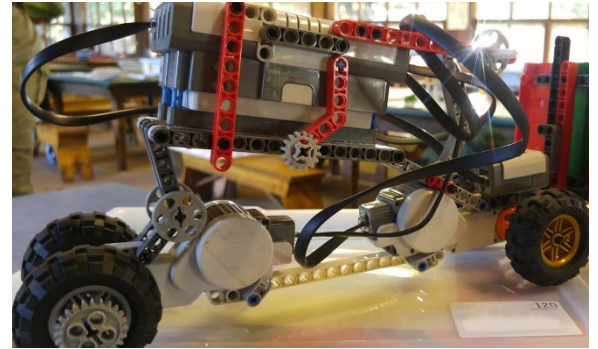
DIY STEM CAMP

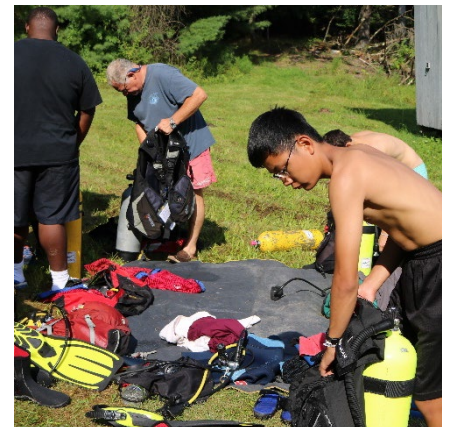
Complete the requirements for BSA Lifeguard including CPR/AED and First Aid.

Aquatics Waterfront

In addition to our proximity to the Delaware river each TMR camp operates a waterfront with boating. All camps provide the opportunity to learn to swim with our aquatics staff or go boating on a picturesque lake. All Scouts will participate in the BSA swim check when they check-in with their Unit at camp.



Ecology

Scouts discover science and the natural world and ecological marvels at their fingertips. TMR is home to a tremendously diverse ecosystem, and the nature lodge staff helps Scouts to explore the world around them, and even beyond into the stars.

Scout Skills

At the Scout Skills or Scout Craft areas campers learn traditional outdoor skills associated with Scouting such as Camping, Wilderness Survival, and Pioneering. Ten Mile River has also expanded skilled trade offerings and new Scout skills like Geocaching with GPS.



Climbing

All three TMR Basecamps operate vertical climbing and rappelling walls where Scouts can complete Climbing Merit Badge. The COPE Courses of Keowa and Aquehonga as well as rappelling at Indian Cliffs are available to interested campers at all camps scheduled through your camps Program Director.



Handicraft

Scouts develop skills working with their hands and also have the opportunity to learn about art fields and history. Scouts work hard on completing their projects and leave camp at the end of the week with both a keepsake to hold on to, and new experience to cherish.

Project LEAF

A first year camper program unique to TMR designed for the first time camper who is not yet First Class. It can be tailored to fit the needs of the individual unit and patrol. This advancement program helps your Scouts understand the patrol method, learn basic scout skills, and sample many other programs of camp.



Field Sports & Biking

Each camp's sports program helps to foster physical fitness for Scouts of all ability levels. Scouts can take part in sports, athletics, and personal fitness merit badges. Troops can challenge each other or the staff to a sporting contest of their choice or go mountain biking and explore the property.

Shooting Sports

Our comprehensive, safe, and fun shooting sports program teaches Scouts the skills, techniques, and respect involved in participating in these sports responsibly. Our ranges offer merit badges as well as open programs to provide the opportunity for those who want to participate in this thrilling activity!



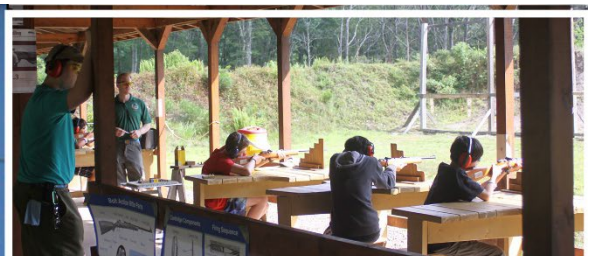
AQUEHONGA

Aquehonga- the “Showplace of TMR” is known for being a premier Patrol Cooking Camp. Campers here get to experience the challenge and successes of preparing and cooking their own meals while in camp, all supervised and controlled by our Commissary Staff. “AQ” is so much more than just a patrol cooking camp, with a state-of-the-art STEM center where instruction is given in Robotics, Communication, Programming, Digital Technology and more! We also feature a large inground pool with a twisty-turny waterslide and fantastic instructor staff. Aquehonga sits on the edge of Half-Moon Lake where Scouts canoe, kayak, row and sail. The camp features a top-of-the-line Scoutcraft area with permanent pioneering structures for Scouts to climb and play on while learning their knots. We have a comprehensive COPE course to include a 35ft. wall, Zip Line, and many challenging low and high elements. Some other program highlights include a Nature Center, First Year Camper program, and Mountain Biking Center.



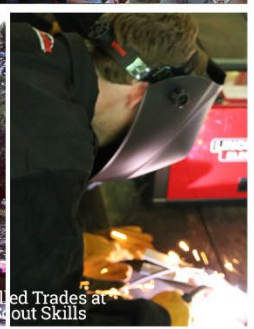
Keowa

Camp Keowa is a large camp full of fun and adventure, sitting on the shores of picturesque Crystal Lake, where Scouts swim, canoe, kayak, sail, motorboat, waterski, and so much more! Campers eat in a large newly renovated Dining Hall full of camp history. The Staff in Keowa lead cheerful Scouting songs in the Dining Hall after every meal! Keowa also features a unique Trail to Eagle Program where Scouts can work on Merit Badges towards their trail to Eagle, participate in a mock Board or Review and get help in planning their projects. These Scouts also leave camp with an Eagle Mentor they can get in touch with after camp. Keowa has a large 16 position rifle range and archery range, as well as a massive field for sports and fun. The week will start and end with a fantastic campfire in Thunderbird Theatre overlooking the gorgeous lake.



RANACHQUA

Camp Ranachqua is nestled deep into the property on quiet Lake Nianque. The Ranachqua staff ensures every Scout who comes into camp has the best possible experience, working closely with their Scouts and classes. The newly renovated Dining Hall features views of the field and lake and is the hub of all activity in camp! At the Performing Arts Center campers have the opportunity to take part in Theater productions, Music, Game Design and Public Speaking! A Scoutcraft and Trade Skills area train Scouts in Knots, Lashing, Welding and Automotive Maintenance during their stay in camp. Each site in Ranachqua is unique, and many feature lean-tos or small cabins. Scouts can swim, row, canoe, kayak, sail, and even motorboat on Lake Nianque.
